



Rental Assistance in the Daytona Beach Area

Volusia County Human Services (VCHS), 250 N. Beach Street (386) 254-4675

Go to VCHS on a Tuesday or Thursday to apply for temporary emergency rental assistance. The doors open at 7:30 a.m. and anyone may apply. Anyone seeking assistance must sign-in at the receptionist window. A caseworker will determine if you meet the criteria for rental assistance.

You will need to have a valid photo ID, social security card for all members of the household, proof of income for all household members for the past 90 days, proof that you have been a resident of Volusia County for the past 60 days (signed lease agreement); and a current notice of eviction from the rental property.

If you are denied assistance, a letter of denial will be given to you by the caseworker. This letter of denial may be presented to other agencies as documentation that you did not receive assistance from Human Services. If you disagree with the denial, you have the right to appeal the decision within three business days to the supervisor.

If you need help with your utilities, you may visit the office on Monday, Wednesday or Friday.

Halifax Urban Ministries (HUM), 215 Bay Street, (386) 252-0156

If, for any reason, you are denied assistance by Volusia County Human Services (VCHS), or you need additional rental assistance, you should make an appointment with HUM. HUM will require the VCHS denial letter or proof of the portion of rent VCHS will pay.

HUM prefers that you call to schedule an appointment. New appointments are only scheduled for the current month. For example, if you call in January, you will not be able to schedule an appointment in February. Appointments are scheduled quickly, so call as soon as you can at the beginning of the month.

If the month is already booked with scheduled appointments, ask for your name to be put on the waiting list. If there is a cancellation or a no show, then they might call you. Otherwise, you will need to try again at the beginning of the next month to schedule an appointment.
