

## Civil Legal Aid Check Up for Low Income Veteran Families

Please read the list of problems. All of these problems are subject to specific laws and those laws may help protect your family.

If you are having one or more of these problems and your household income is very low, you may be eligible for free services from your local legal aid program. Their staff may be able to explain the law and how to enforce your rights. They may also be able to take your case, or suggest another place to find help.

### Please check any problems on the list below that you are having:

- Victim of a scam (including bad checks, email and phone offers)
- Identify theft or other credit problems
- Debt collection (including court hearings and/or phone harassment)
- Bankruptcy
- Getting phones/heat/electric installed or disconnected
- Consumer purchase /sales agreement that didn't work out as you expected
- Problems with an auto purchase or repair
- School services for your child (including discipline & special education services)
- Bullying/harassment of your child at school
- Job problems (hiring, firing, getting paid the right amount or on time, family medical leave, etc.)
- Federal or State taxes (filing or getting the earned income credit or refund check)
- Child visitation, custody or child support
- Enforcing or changing a court order related to family issues (inc. child support)
- Dealing with probate court (guardianship, wills & estates)
- Abuse, dating violence or stalking (yourself or a family member)
- Getting needed medical services for yourself or a family member
- Living in unsafe housing
- Foreclosure on your house or the building in which you rent
- Paying property taxes on your home
- Problems with your landlord, including eviction
- Need for reasonable accommodation in housing (including modifications, service animals, ramps, etc.)
- Discrimination in housing (based on race, gender, disability, etc.)
- Getting or keeping government benefits ( food stamps, SSI, disability, etc)
- Problems getting unemployment compensation
- Problems with military or veteran's benefits
- Problems with work-related injury and/or workers compensation
- Being sued by someone
