Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Grandparents Legal Advocacy Project?

The Grandparents Legal Advocacy Project is a program of Community Legal Services of Mid-Florida (CLSMF) that provides free legal assistance for grandparents and other seniors who are caring for a minor child in their home. The Project provides services in Citrus, Hernando, Lake, Marion, Putnam & Sumter Counties.

Am I eligible to receive free legal services?

Free legal help is available if you are:

- ▶ A Grandparent (aged 55 or older) caring for a child who is 18 or younger who lives with you , OR
- ▶ A Senior (aged 55 or older) caring for:
 - ✓ A child aged 18 or younger (you cannot be the child's parent) related to you by blood, marriage or adoption, who lives with you
 - ✓ A person with a disability related to you by blood, marriage or adoption, who lives with you

If you are not a resident of a county served by this project or are ineligible under these guidelines, please visit www.clsmf.org to see if you qualify under any of our other programs.

What services do you provide?

We can help you with the following issues:

Consumer Issues

Harassing debt collectors, repossession, garnishments of wages and bank accounts, consumer fraud

Education

Children with disabilities in public school

Family Law

Domestic violence injunctions, custody cases, divorces, child support

Housing

Evictions, foreclosures, lockouts, utility shut-offs, contract for deed issues and failure of a landlord or housing authority to make repairs

Public Benefits

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Food Stamps (SNAP), Medicaid and Veterans Benefits

The legal services you seek do not have to be related to providing care.

How do I sign up?

Fill out an application online at www.clsmf.org or call the Helpline for your county as listed on the back of this brochure.

Can I get financial help?

While CLSMF does not provide direct financial support, we may be able to help you obtain:

- Foster care payments
- Adoption subsidies
- Child support payments
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) child-only grants
- Social Security benefits
- Disability benefits
- Tax Credits
- Subsidized guardianships
